BLACKSTONE MOUNTAIN LODGE IS A PET-FREE RESORT.

Blackstone Mountain Lodge only recognizes canines for service work as per The Service Dogs Act and Blind Person's Rights Act of Alberta. Both acts do not offer protection under law for service cats, snakes or any other type of animal. Emotional support dogs are not permitted at this time.

Pet fees will not be charged for service dogs, but there will be a \$500 cleaning fee for all unauthorized pets.

Per the SDA, Blackstone Mountain Lodge will protect public access rights for qualified service dogs. A canine may be 'qualified' in a number of ways. The primary way is to obtain the canine from a school which is recognized by Assistance Dogs International (ADI).



A registered school ID card that is affiliated with ADI is required to be sent to the hotel at the time of booking and shown at check in. Note that the card must contain the ADI logo.

SDA and ADI canines in training are also permitted by law. For more information call or visit;

ALBERTA LAW

To be a qualified service dog under Alberta law, the canine must have:

- Graduated from a program that is accredited by Assistance Dogs International (ADI);
- Completed a program delivered by an organization identified on the Government's Qualified List; or passed a test administered by an organization identified on the Qualified List.



Reservations will only be valid when a copy of ID has been received. A further verification of the ID will be required at check in.

Only qualified SDA and ADI canines are permitted. Blackstone Mountain Lodge allows for a maximum of two SDA and ADI compliant canines per suite.
